

Geoconservation Talk Notre Dame College (29/04/2009)

On April 29, 2009, we were invited by Notre Dame College to talk on geoconservation to their Form II, IV and VI students. The talk, presented by Steven Cheung, was one of our series of school geoconservation popularisation program in this year.

During the 30 minutes talk, Steven highlighted the followings:-

1. The aesthetics of Hong Kong geological landscape;
2. The “rare precious stone” of Hong Kong;
3. The consequences of destroying rocks and landforms;
4. Reasons for establishing geopark

People are normally mistaken that geoconservation is a very stern and boring topic. Steven had proved that such concept is wrong by his humorous and interesting speech which attracted the full attention of the students. The students’ active response to his questions together with the distribution of the souvenirs created a very joyous atmosphere.
