Po Toi Country Park Campaign

Po Toi is the southern-most island of Hong Kong. The famous geological and

geomorphological features such as the Coffin Rock, Palm Cliff and Tortoise Climbing

up the Mountain attract many hikers. Meanwhile, it is a natural habitat of the endemic

Romer's Tree Frog which is internationally endangered. The special geographical

location together with the natural environment makes the island a crucial refueling

stop for migratory birds. More than 300 species - 60% of the Hong Kong Total - have

been recorded from the island.

In early 2012 workers cleared vegetation on the island and put hundreds of concrete

slabs on Po Toi, damaging the landscape and ecological value. In fact, the Planning

Department has suggested in 2001 that Po Toi Islands should be zoned as Country

Park but this has never happened.

Designating Country Park for Po Toi is the best way to protect its landscape,

ecological, cultural and recreational values from destruction.
