

- BUT almost every community has a wonderful gelogical history, or unique and beautiful scenery, or really interesting points of interests, that would capture the attention of tourists.



- experience





















# Interpretation and visitors

- Knowledge and information about geological heritage is often not presented a way thatis easily understood by the general public.
- As a rule, this information comes in the style of scientific treatises which, besides using highly specialised language, leave visitors in the dark and limit touristic impact.
- Information must be accessible and intelligible for the general public, presented in a few basic concepts and with clarity, resulting in the combined efforts of scientists, interpretation experts and designers.
