
Book Recommendation: "The Principles of Geotourism" (Hard Copy)

Springer, the world-renowned earth science book publisher has recently released "The Principles of Geotourism" which is the English version of the Chinese edition of 'The Principles of Tourism Earth-science' first published in 1989.
